The Railway Man



Decades later, and with the love and support of his wife Patti, Eric attempts to make peace with his past, and sets out to confront the Japanese interpreter he holds responsible for much of his treatment.

Starring Academy Award-winners Colin Firth and Nicole Kidman, and Jeremy Irvine, the film is a tale of survival, love and redemption.

FIFE

The north and east are peppered with romantic pan-tiled fishing villages from a bygone age, when the sea provided food and work local communities. To the south and west, villages, castles, royal dwellings and religious abbeys can be found all over where you can trace Fife's royal history, political scandals and social evolution.

St Andrews is the 'home of golf' with the Royal and Ancient Golf Club and the world famous Old Course. The town also has the oldest university in Scotland, at 600 years old and the third-earliest in the English-speaking world.
